Notable Moments in Masonry: January

On the 26th of this month in 1887, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, noted creator of the beloved Sherlock Holmes, received his 1st degree at Phoenix Lodge # 257 in Southsea, Hampshire. It is said that the famous "consulting detective" was modeled after Doyle's medical professor, Joseph Bell, who repeatedly astounded the young Doyle with his deductive reasoning to arrive at a patient's diagnosis. Symbols of Masonry were often woven into the Sherlockian mysteries.
