## **Fire Suppression Tool**

Cataract Lodge is parterning with Compass Lodge No 265 to provide the Robbinsdale Police Force with Fire Suppression Tools (FST). Under WB Andrew Hall's guidance, this past year we raised \$7,500 with a Taco Bar, all of which will be used to purchase and provide these life saving tools to first responders. FST's are easily activated and distribute an aerosolized powder tht floods up to 5,300 square feet for 35 seconds reducing temperatures within an active burn by 1,000 degrees and thereby saving lives and property. Both Lodges plan to jointly present these FST's to the City of Robbinsdale, during the regularly scheduled City Hall meeting on August  $5^{\rm th}$  (4100 Lakeview Ave N) .



Additionally, it is planned that each Lodge Light issue will include a listing of birthdays of our brothers as well as a short "Get to Know Your Brother" bio. Our first was of our illustrious Senior Warden, Br Jeff Nielsen, which was in the latest issue.



WB Ron Wagner was raised in 1989 in Century Lodge No 338, which, since, through merger, became one with Cataract Lodge No 2. He has been a vital member of our Lodge but also Excelsior Lodge No 113 as its Past Master. We point this out because WB Ron has been chosen by Excelsior Lodge to receive the prestigious Hiram Award. ### -Checking in on traveling Brothers



Pictured on Left is the first Masonic Lodge in Alaska, White Pass Lodge No 1 of Skagway, AK chartered in 1901 with its memorial cornerstone. On the right is the Masonic Temple belonging to Ketchican Lodge No 19. The wooden sculpture of a bald eagle is reputed to relate to the origin of the town's name from the Tlingit, Kichxáan, meaning the "thundering wings of an eagle." Noteworthy, the sign on the first floor behind the eagle is for their tenant, Michael's Nail Salon.
