

Greetings From The WEST!

Brothers,

I have started traveling again after the world was shut down because of Covid. In 2019, I flew over 140,000 miles across the US, Europe and the Middle East which included more than 25 trips and over 45 flights. Over these past 4 years, I have taken only 10 trips and 18 flights. I mention this because during the lockdown, I made up my mind to visit lodges in the many places I travel to IF I was ever to travel again.

In the last 4 years I have had the opportunity to attend Stated Communications or Degree Rituals in Seattle, Atlanta, Des Moines and Knoxville. I visited lodge buildings in Grand Rapids (MI), Alaska and the Dominican Republic. Through it all I have learned that although we may do things differently, we are all brothers.

Recently, I was scheduled to travel to Saudi Arabia, and I hoped to attend a lodge meeting in Riyadh, the capital. I have to say I have become better at finding the Square and Compass as I travel. I see it on buildings of all sorts. But in my many visits to the Middle East I have never seen a masonic symbol anywhere.

The relationship between Freemasonry and Arab countries is complex and varies from one country to another, but Freemasonry is officially banned in Saudi Arabia. The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, being an Islamic state governed by Shari'ah law, has strict regulations against any organization or practice perceived to be secretive, subversive, or contradictory to Islamic principles. Freemasonry is viewed with suspicion due to its secretive nature, historical associations with Western countries, and the perception that it might conflict with Islamic beliefs and social norms. As a result, Freemasonry is severely restricted if not prohibited. Freemasonry may exist underground, but not without significant risk to its members. Meetings, as a result, are extraordinarily difficult to find.



On 9 September 1890, Brother Harland D Sanders came into the world. He is often held up as the very model of a persistent entrepreneur who took 62 years to finally achieve success. His secret for his 'Kentucky Fried Chicken' was much more than his famous eleven herbs and spices. His genius was deep frying breaded chicken in a pressure cooker. At the age of 45, he was commissioned a Kentucky Colonel by then governor, Ruby Laffoon. Colonel Sanders was raised in Indiana in 1919, but later affiliated with Hugh Harris Lodge No 938 in Corbin, Kentucky in 1953
