

Notable Moments in Masonry: October

October 19, 1781 was a date of extreme importance to the fledgling United Colonies of America, for on that date the last battle of the American Revolution ended with the surrender of Lord Cornwallis to the Continental Army at Yorktown, Virginia. You might ask what this has to do with Masonry and the answer is, it was a Mason who was key to that victory. The British forces were blockaded at Yorktown. All Washington had to do was get the Continental Army there, but the troops, without food, supplies or ammunition were on the brink of mutiny. Only \$20,000 in coin (half a million today) could save the day but Congress was bankrupt. Haym Salomon, a Jewish immigrant from Poland, a Philadelphia Mason and a Son of Liberty immediately raised the money and saved the Revolution.
